## *Village Awarded PARTF Grant*

The Village Council is pleased to announce that the Village has been awarded a Park and Recreational Trust Fund Grant in the amount of \$480,000 to both upgrade existing facilities in Village Park, and to construct and develop new recreational amenities. This grant award is the culmination of a long planning and application process over the last two years as the Village sought funding to improve recreation for our citizens according to our Master Plan that was developed with community input. The project turned in by the Village will cost \$960,000. Half of the project cost will be paid for by the PARTF Grant, and half will be paid for by existing funding already received from the Federal government. Plans call for the construction of a multipurpose trail, shelter, frisbee golf course, amphitheater, volleyball court, and complete renovation of the basketball and tennis court complex. We now look forward to the actual construction and completion of the project over the next couple of years. The N.C. Parks and Recreation Trust Fund (PARTF) will award over \$17 million in grants to fund 39 local parks and recreation projects across the state. The North Carolina Parks and Recreation Authority (Authority) approved the grants at its meeting held on Aug. 26 at the Nature Research Center in Raleigh. The Village of Tobaccoville grant

application scored well within the top half of the projects that were awarded. Local communities applied for the grants to fund land acquisition, development and renovation of public park and recreation areas. Each year, the Authority is required to allocate 30% of PARTF's total funding to local government projects. The Authority considered 49 local grant applications requesting \$20.9 million in total. The maximum grant awarded for a single project was \$500,000. Awardees must match funds dollar-for-dollar for the awarded amount. This year, \$17.9 million was allocated to PARTF for local projects—an amount at least triple that of most years in the last decade. With these awards, PARTF has now made more than 1,000 grants to build parks in communities across the state. "Congratulations to the local governments that received Parks and Recreation Trust Fund grants to invest in the health and quality of life of their communities," said D. Reid Wilson, secretary of the N.C. Department of Natural and Cultural Resources. "The historic increases in funding by the legislature and Governor Cooper will result in more North Carolina families having ready access to outdoor recreation."

# *Recycling Bulletin!!!!*

For your convenience, we are printing these recycling schedules in the newsletter. Recycling is picked up on every other Wednesday depending on which route you are on. **Please note that if your garbage is normally picked up on Monday, then your recycling is picked up every other Wednesday on the blue route.**

**If your garbage is normally picked up on Tuesday, your recycling is picked up every other Wednesday on the red route.** The schedule below shows you the pickup day and routes through June of 2023. Please remember that you must use the cart that is for recycling only. If there is trash in the recycling cart or if you use the

wrong cart, it cannot be picked up. The roll carts must be placed at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on the day of the pickup. All recyclable materials must be placed in the cart loosely and not bagged. ## *Park Rentals*

The Village Park has three wonderful facilities which can be rented for various functions at reasonable rates for both residents and non-residents. Rentals for the Community Center and the Picnic Shelter and Gazebo can be made 7 days a week except on holidays. All Sunday rentals must start after 1 p.m. for the Community Center and after 1 p.m. for the shelters. There are a few other conditions that apply to the available rental hours for each facility. The Alice Watts Tuttle Community Center contains a main room, 2 conference rooms, restrooms, lobby, fireplace, and storage area. Amenities include a sound system, TV, stage, round and rectangular tables, chairs, etc. It is a perfect place to have a reunion, reception or other event. Our staff will set the facility up to your specifications and we will provide an attendant for all facility rentals.

Resident rates for the Community Center are as follows:

Main Room -\$35 hour  
 Conf. Room-\$25 hour  
 Kitchen-\$30 flat fee  
 Entire Building-\$60 hour  
 Security Deposit-\$100

A minimum rental for the Community Center is 2 hours. For example a resident can rent the main room (which handles a crowd of 100 people easily) and the kitchen for 4 hours for a total of \$270. This includes the security deposit of \$100 which is returned after the rental if the building is clean and undamaged and vacated on time. Our Picnic Shelter and Gazebo rates for residents are as follows:

Picnic Shelter-\$15 hour  
 Gazebo-\$15 hour  
 Both Facilities-\$30 hour  
 Security Deposit-\$25

Rentals of the shelters must be for a minimum of 3 hours and a maximum of 5 hours and end 1 hour prior to gate close. Rates for residents for all our facilities are less than the non-resident rates. All of our contracts and pictures of our facilities are listed on our website on the PARK page at:

There are some additional requirements for each facility rental. There are rules that apply to each facility which must be honored in order to get back the security deposit. One must also adhere to all park rules and regulations for Village Park.
